STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Authorize Corporations to Hold Stockholders' Meetings Outside the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 53, § 23, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 23 of chapter 53 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Corporations may, among other provisions, determine by their by-laws the manner of calling and conducting meetings; whether they shall be held within or without the State; the number of members that constitute a quorum; the number of votes to be given by shareholders; the date as of which stockholders shall be entitled to vote at any meeting or to receive dividends or rights and whether or not stock transfer books shall be closed; by whom any and all officers, except president and directors, shall be elected; by whom vacancies in the board of directors or other offices may be filled; the tenure of the several offices; the mode of voting by proxy and of selling shares for neglect to pay assessments; and may enforce such by-laws by penalties not exceeding \$20.'
