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#### AN ACT Relating to Use of Decoys and Blinds in Merrymeeting Bay.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 89, repealed and replaced. Section 89 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 89. Decoys and blinds in Merrymeeting Bay. The provisions of the 2 following paragraphs shall apply to the waters of Kennebec river, known as Merrymeeting Bay, bounded as follows: From the high tension wires at Chop's Point to the first dam on the Androscoggin river, to the first road bridge on the Muddy, Cathance, Abbagadasset and Eastern rivers, and the Richmond-Dresden bridge on the Kennebec river, being in the counties of Cumberland, Sagadahoc and Lincoln.

No artificial cover which is termed stationary blind, or parts thereof, used for hunting purposes shall be left or allowed to remain in the waters of Merrymeeting Bay, as described, between one hour after legal shooting time and one hour before legal shooting time.

No ducks decoys shall be allowed to remain in waters of Merrymeeting Bay from one hour after legal shooting time until one hour before legal shooting time.'
