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

STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Abolishing Tribal Committee of Penobscot Indians and Transferring
Duties to Governor and Council.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 25, §§ 338-339, repealed. Sections 338 and 339 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 25, § 340, sub-§ II, amended. Subsection II of section 340 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 'II. By adoption into the tribe as determined by its tribal committee the Governor of Maine and the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the 2 following sections 341 and 342.'
- Sec. 3. Amendatory clause. Wherever in the Revised Statutes, the words "tribal committee" appear as they apply to the Penobscot Indians, they shall be amended to "the Governor of Maine and the Executive Council."
