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

STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Permitting Trust Funds of Penobscot Indians to be Used to Defend Indian Rights.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 346-A, additional. Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended, by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 346-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 346-A. Trust funds to defend Indians rights. The Governor and Council, with the consent of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, may withdraw from any trust funds for the benefit of said tribe a sum not to exceed \$4,000 for the purpose of defending Indian rights.'
