STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Lights on Rear of Trucks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 43, amended. Section 43 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Section 1 of chapter 56 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, as follows:

'All motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers of 7 feet or over in width shall be equipped with at least 2 signal lamps on the rear of such vehicle, which lamps shall be within 12 inches of the extreme extension of the rear of such vehicle. Such lamps shall be so constructed so that they shall also serve as stop lights and tail lights. The provisions of this section shall not apply to those vehicles under the regulation of the Maine Public Utilities Commission or the Interstate Commerce Commission.'
