STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Discontinue Fort Kent State Normal School and to Use the Buildings for Other Educational Purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 41, § 223, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 223 of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 375 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The Farmington State Teachers' College at Farmington, the Gorham State Teachers' College at Gorham, the Washington State Teachers' College at Machias the Fort Kent State Normal School at Fort Kent and the Aroostook State Teachers' College at Presque Isle shall be conducted for the purposes and upon the principles herein set forth.'

- Sec. 2. Lease of buildings. The State Department of Education is hereby authorized and directed to lease, without consideration, to the town of Fort Kent all the buildings located at the Fort Kent State Normal School to be used in conjunction with the area high school being constructed. Such leased buildings shall be used by the town for living quarters for teachers, for classrooms and for any other educational purposes in connection with said area high school that the town deems advisable.
- Sec. 3. Field representative. The State Department of Education shall appoint a field representative assigned to the Aroostook State Teachers' College. He shall, among the duties assigned to him, have charge of any of said leased buildings used as dormitories and shall aid in any guidance work necessary at said area high school.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1958 the sum of \$25,000. This appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this act have been accomplished.
