## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

#### AN ACT Increasing Compensation of Members of Boards of Registration in Cities over 39,000 Inhabitants and Time of Sessions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 3, § 13, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 13 of chapter 3 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 396 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'In cities of 39,000 inhabitants and less than 50,000 inhabitants, the chairman of the board shall receive 3,050 3,250 per year and the other 2 members of the board shall receive 2,700 2,900 per year and such additional amounts as may be authorized by the municipal officers or board of finance.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 3, § 16, amended. The 1st and 2nd sentences of section 16 of chapter 3 of the Revised Statutes are hereby amended to read as follows: 'In cities of 30,000 inhabitants or more, boards of registration shall be in session every day of the year, Saturdays, Sundays and court holidays excepted, for the purpose of registration and enrollment of voters and to revise and correct the voting list. Open sessions shall be held for the purpose of registration and enrollment of voters from 9 to 12 o'clock in the morning, and from 2 to 5 o'clock in the afternoon Saturday afternoon excepted.'
