RESOLVE, Authorizing Use of Passamaquoddy Trust Funds for Housing.

Passamaquoddy trust funds for housing; authorizing use. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Welfare be, and hereby is, authorized to use \$100,000 of the Passamaquoddy tribe trust funds to provide new housing for the reservation at Pleasant Point and Peter Dana Point.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Passamaquoddy tribe is in dire need of houses. An attempt to purchase government surplus houses was unsuccessful. It is felt that this method will allow the building of houses without using general fund revenue. The money can be replaced over a period of years by turning back to the trust funds the net income from the sale of timber.
