**AN ACT Relating to Trial Terms of Superior Court in Aroostook County.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., c. 106, § 11, sub-§ II, repealed and replaced.** Subsection II of section 11 of chapter 106 of the Revised Statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

**'II. Aroostook:** After January 1, 1958, at Houlton on the 1st Tuesday of February, the 1st Tuesday of April, the 1st Tuesday of September and the 2nd Tuesday of November for civil and criminal business, provided the grand jury shall only attend at the April, September and November terms unless specially summoned by order of a Justice of said Court. All recognizances for appearance to abide action by the grand jury shall be for appearance at the term at which the next regular session of the grand jury is held, but appeals in criminal as well as civil matters and removals shall be to the next regular term.'

**Sec. 2. Transfer of property.** The county commissioners of Aroostook county are authorized to sell and convey the county courthouse at Caribou to the inhabitants of the town of Caribou, and the inhabitants of the town of Caribou are authorized to accept such conveyance, for any nominal consideration.
