STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Change of Residence of Voter.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 3, § 24, amended. The 1st sentence of section 24 of chapter 3 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The residence of a voter as stated upon the list of voters used at the last preceding election shall be deemed his last and usual place of abode, unless he shall have given notice in person or in writing over his own signature to the city clerk of a change of his residence, which notice, if given after the first day of April, shall entitle him to have his residence so corrected on the voting list to be used at the next subsequent election general register, but shall not entitle him to have his registration otherwise changed, nor to vote in a ward or precinct other than that in which he resided on the first day of April.'
