STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Lights on Rear of Trucks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 43, amended. Section 43 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 56 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, as follows:

'All motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers of 7 feet or over in width shall be equipped with 2 signal lights, 2 taillights and 2 stop lights, which lights shall be within 12 inches of the extreme extension of the rear of such vehicle.

Such lamps may be constructed into one unit made up of signal light, stop light and taillight with proper bulb and lens to differentiate each designated light.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to those vehicles under the regulation of the Maine Public Utilities Commission or the Interstate Commerce Commission.'
