**AN ACT Relating to Representation in Legislative District for Town of
West Paris.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature has adjourned; and

Whereas, it is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the Town of West Paris to establish and make proper provision for legislative classification of said town and for the election of Representatives until the next decennial census and apportionment of Representatives; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1957, c. 130, § 7-A, additional. Chapter 130 of the private and special laws of 1957 is amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 7-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 7-A. Legislative representation for Town of West Paris. Until the next legislative apportionment of Representatives, the Town of West Paris shall remain in the same legislative district with which the Town of Paris is now classed.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
