COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 12, L. D. 21, Bill, "An Act  
Relating to Town Meetings of Sanford."

Amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof the following  
Referendum:

'Referendum; effective date; certificate to Secretary of State.  
This act shall take effect 90 days after adjournment of the Legis-  
lature, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the  
legal voters of the Town of Sanford at any annual or special town  
meeting called and held for the purpose. Such special meeting  
shall be called, advertised and conducted according to the law  
relating to municipal elections; provided that the selectmen shall  
not be required to prepare, nor the town clerk to post, a new list  
of voters, and for the purpose of registration of voters said  
selectmen shall be in session 2 hours next preceding such special  
meeting.

The town clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this act  
to the following question: "Shall the Act Relating to Town Meet-  
ings of Sanford, passed by the 99th Legislature, be accepted?"  
The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against  
the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

This act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof  
immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters  
voting at said meeting; provided the total number of votes cast  
for and against the acceptance of this act at said meeting equaled  
or exceeded 20% of the total vote cast for all candidates for  
Governor in said town at the next preceding gubernatorial election.

The result of the vote shall be declared by the municipal  
officers of the Town of Sanford and due certificate thereof shall  
be filed by the town clerk with the Secretary of State.'
