STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Increasing Salary of Members of the Legislature.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 10, § 2, amended. The first sentence of the first paragraph of section 2 of chapter 10 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 478 of the public laws of 1955 and by section 1 of chapter 414 of the public laws of 1957, is further amended to read as follows:

'Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall receive ~~\$1,400~~ \$2,000 for the regular session of the Legislature, and shall be paid for travel at each legislative session once each week at the rate of 5c per mile to and from his place of abode, the mileage to be determined by the most reasonable direct route.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 10, § 2, amended. The first sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 2 of chapter 10 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 478 of the public laws of 1955 and by section 1 of chapter 414 of the public laws of 1957, is further amended to read as follows:

'The President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each receive ~~\$1,650~~ \$2,250 for each regular session of the Legislature, with the same mileage as other members, and subject to the same deduction in case of each absence.'

Sec. 3. Effective date. This act shall take effect on the first Wednesday of January, 1961.
