STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Permitting the Digging of Clams in Limits of Saco for Bait Only.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Digging of clams in limits of Saco for bait. It shall be lawful to dig clams on any of the flats within the territorial limits of the City of Saco, York County, provided said clams are not used for any other purpose than as bait for fishing. Such digging and taking shall be limited to residents of the City of Saco only and not more than one bushel of clams per person per tide may be taken. Provided further, that no one shall dig clams for fish bait in Saco without first having obtained a permit from the Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries. No fee shall be charged for such a permit and such permits may be granted or revoked at the discretion of the commissioner.
