STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to increase Retirement Benefit of Clyde P. Walker of Stratton.

Retirement benefit of Clyde P. Walker; increased. Resolved: That the retirement benefit now being paid to Clyde P. Walker of Stratton, under the provisions of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, be increased by the amount of \$375.44 monthly.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Accident happened June 10, 1950. He was unloading chloride at a barn at Goldbrook. As he went to throw a bag up to a fellow, the floor timber let go and threw him back and snapped his head. He started having a terrible head-ache immediately which kept growing worse. They allowed him \$9,000 compensation from December 18, 1950 up to July 2, 1951.

All he is getting now is \$24.56 a month retirement. He has no other means to live on. His wife not only has to take care of her husband but her mother who is a bed patient at Augusta.

Mr. Walker was a faithful employee of the State for 21 years. He would work day and night for the State as patrolman. He was very loyal to his job. He should have a special pension from the State for he gave practically all his life's work to the State and as a result of this life's work, he is permanently injured.

He was pronounced dead 3 times while he was in the Boston hospital. The result has left him so that he can't get his balance and cannot work. He was in the hospital 3 months.
