RESOLVE, Opening Wilson Lake, Franklin County, to Ice Fishing.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is necessary to permit ice fishing in Wilson Lake during the winter of 1959; and

Whereas, such legislation is in the best interest of conserving our natural resources; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Wilson Lake; open to ice fishing.

Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Wilson Lake, Franklin County, to ice fishing.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
