**AN ACT Requiring Uninsured Motorist Coverage in Liability Insurance Policies.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 60, § 6-A, additional.** Chapter 60 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 6-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 6-A. Uninsured motorist condition. No standard automobile liability insurance policy or motor vehicle liability policy, as defined in chapter 22, section 75, shall be delivered or issued for delivery in this State unless coverage is provided therein or supplemental thereto, to the amount or limit of at least \$10,000 on account of injury to or death of any one person, and subject to such limits as respects injury to or death of one person, of at least \$20,000 on account of any one accident resulting in injury to or death of more than one person, under provisions approved by the Insurance Commissioner, for the protection of persons insured thereunder who are legally entitled to recover damages from owners or operators of uninsured motor vehicles, trailers or semi-trailers and hit-and-run motor vehicles, trailers or semi-trailers because of bodily injury, sickness or disease, including death resulting therefrom, the rates for such coverage to be determined by the Insurance Commissioner in accordance with sections 331 to 347.'
