COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 123, L.D. 178, Bill, "An Act
Regulating Taking of Alewives in Town of Orland."

Amend said Bill by inserting after the Title and before the enacting clause the following emergency preamble:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature adjourns unless passed as emergencies; and

Whereas, the people of Orland should be permitted to vote and take action upon the following legislation at their annual town meeting early in March; and

Whereas, rules and regulations governing the taking of alewives should be promulgated before the beginning of the 1959 season; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof the following emergency clause:

'Emergency Clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.'
