IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Employment of Minors Under 18 Years of Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 30, § 22, amended. Section 22 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

‘Sec. 22. Employment of minors under 18. No minor under 18 years of age shall be employed ~~in, about or in connection with any manufacturing or mechanical establishment, laundry, dry cleaning establishment or bakery~~ in any capacity that the commissioner determines, **after public hearing**, to be hazardous, dangerous to their lives or limbs, injurious to morals or where their health will be injured. The provisions of this section shall not apply to minors in public and approved private schools wherein mechanical equipment is installed and operated primarily for purposes of instruction.’
