#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Providing for a Review of Laws of Department of Institutional Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Review of Department of Institutional Service Laws. The Commissioner of the Department of Institutional Service is authorized, during the fiscal years commencing July 1, 1959 and terminating June 30, 1961, to study the present general provisions of the statutes relating to the Department of Institutional Service and the State Probation and Parole Board, specifically the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 27, and the public laws of 1957, chapter 387, and any other chapters or sections of the laws pertaining to the Department of Institutional Service, and to report to the next regular session of the Legislature such changes and amendments as may be necessary or desirable to consolidate such statutes to make such statutes more readily understandable, workable and useful to the persons affected thereby. For this purpose the Commissioner of the Department of Institutional Service may employ such technical and clerical assistance and hold such public hearings as may be necessary.
- Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1960 to carry out the purpose of this act. Said sum shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1961.
