IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Employment of Minors Under 16 Years of Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 30, § 23, amended. Section 23 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 335 of the public laws of 1955, is further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 23. Employment of minors under 16 years of age prohibited in certain establishments. No minor under 16 years of age shall be employed, permitted or suffered to work in, about or in connection with any manufacturing or mechanical establishment, **construction activity, woods operation, tree surgery, transportation company,** hotel, rooming house, laundry, dry cleaning establishment, bakery, bowling alley, poolroom, commercial places of amusement, including traveling shows and circuses, or in any theater or moving picture house. The provisions of this section pertaining to theaters shall not apply to minors under 16 years of age who are employed or in training as theatrical actors.'
