#### STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Territorial Distribution of and Increasing Number of Medical Examiners of Somerset County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 89, § 243, amended. Section 243 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapters 283 and 284, and by section 78 of chapter 429, all of the public laws of 1957, is further amended by inserting after the 3rd sentence a new sentence to read as follows:

'Of the 3 medical examiners of Somerset County, one shall be appointed from the Bingham area.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 89, § 243, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 243 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 78 of chapter 429 of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

'The number of medical examiners so to be appointed shall be as follows: For the Counties of Franklin, Knox, Lincoln, Piscataquis, Sagadahoc Somerset and Waldo, 2 each; for the Counties of Hancock, Oxford, Somerset and Washington, 3 each; for the Counties of Kennebec and York, 4 each; for the Counties of Androscoggin and Aroostook, 5 each; for the Counties of Cumberland and Penobscot, 7 each; and they shall be appointed with reference to territorial distribution.'
