IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Legal Suits in Name of Assignor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 113, § 168, amended. Section 168 of chapter 113 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 168. In suit in name of assignor, docket indersed; costs. The name and place of residence of an assignee, if known, shall, at any time during the pendency of the suit, be indersed by request of the defendant on a writ of process commenced in the name of his assignor the docket or further proceedings thereon shall be stayed; and if. If the defendant prevails, judgment for his costs shall be rendered against the plaintiff and such assignee as if both had been originally joined in the action; but if. If not so indersed and proceedings are stayed, the defendant may maintain an action on the case against the assignee for his costs.'
