STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Permit Before Examination for Applicant to Practice Barbering.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 224, amended. The last paragraph of section 224 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 79 of the public laws of 1955 and as amended by chapter 63 of the public laws of 1957, is further amended to read as follows:

'If any applicant to practice hairdressing and beauty culture, or barbering, who has been a resident of the State of Maine for a period of at least 6 months, qualifies for examination, the board may issue to such applicant, until the results of the applicant's examination have been given, a permit to practice hairdressing and beauty culture or barbering under the supervision of a person registered to practice hairdressing and beauty culture or barbering, as the case may be. Such applicant shall not be considered an apprentice. The applicant shall pay to the board a fee of \$3.'
