STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Nonresident Motor Vehicle Privileges.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 67-A, additional. Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 67-A, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 67-A. Nonresident exemption not allowed. The provisions of law authorizing the operation of motor vehicles over the highways of the State by non-residents, when such vehicles shall be duly registered or licensed under the laws of some other state or foreign country, shall not apply to any nonresident who shall accept employment, or engage in any trade, profession or gainful occupation in this State. In every case where a nonresident shall accept employment, or engage in any trade, profession or gainful occupation in the State, or shall enter his children to be educated in the public schools of the State, such non-resident shall be required to register his motor vehicles in this State within in 7 days if such motor vehicles are proposed to be operated or remain on the highways of the State.

This section shall not apply to:

- I. Residents of the State of New Hampshire, the Province of New Brunswick and the Province of Quebec;
- II. Nonresident salesmen who carry samples and solicit business in Maine, but do not make deliveries; and
- III. Nonresidents attending college in Maine.’
