STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Draggers in Sheepscot Bay.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 27-C, additional. Chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 27-C, to read as follows:

'Sec. 27-C. Use of draggers in parts of Sheepscot Bay. It shall be unlawful, between the first day of November and the first day of the following March, to use a dragger or any other dragging apparatus, except standard scallop drags, for the taking of fish or lobsters on the ocean bottom of those parts of Sheepscot Bay, Sagadahoc and Lincoln Counties, from a point on the south end of Seguin Island easterly to Pumpkin Island and thence northerly to Ocean Point.'
