AN ACT Relating to Salaries of Judge and Recorder of Biddeford Municipal Court.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1931, c. 85, § 1, amended.** Section 1 of chapter 85 of the private and special laws of 1931, as amended by chapter 154 of the private and special laws of 1947, is further amended to read as follows:

'**Sec. 1. Judge of Biddeford Municipal Court, salary; recorder.** The judge of the municipal court of the City of Biddeford shall receive an annual salary of ~~\$7,800~~ \$3,000, payable quarterly, out of the county treasury on the first days of July, October, January and April, which shall be in full for all his services. ~~And in~~ In case of the death, resignation or removal from office of the judge, his recorder shall act as and shall receive the salary of the judge until the judge's successor is appointed and qualified, and shall be subject to all the provisions of law pertaining to the office.'

**Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1899, c. 24, § 2, amended.** Section 2 of chapter 24 of the private and special laws of 1899, as last amended by chapter 97 of the private and special laws of 1945, is further amended to read as follows:

'**Sec. 2. Salary of recorder.** For all services rendered, except when there is a vacancy in the office of judge, the recorder shall be paid from the county treasury the sum of ~~\$7,000~~ \$1,500 annually, payable on the first days of January, April, July and October, which shall be in full for all services rendered as such recorder.'

**Sec. 3. Effective date.** The provisions of this act shall be retroactive to January 1, 1959.
