STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Age of Applicants for Motor Vehicle Driver's License.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 5th sentence of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'No license shall be issued to any person under 15 17 years of age.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 7th sentence of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 181 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

'Any person who is at least 15 17 years of age may apply to the Secretary of State for an instruction permit.'

- Sec. 3. R. S., c. 22, § 65, amended. Section 65 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 3 of chapter 181 of the public laws of 1955, is further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 65. Unlicensed persons not to operate motor vehicles. No person shall operate a motor vehicle upon any way in this State unless licensed according to the provisions of this chapter; but the. The provisions of this section shall not prevent the operation of a motor vehicle by an unlicensed person, not less than 15 17 years of age who holds an instruction permit, if riding beside a licensed operator in said vehicle for the purpose of becoming familiar with the use and handling of a motor vehicle preparatory to taking out license for driving;, and provided further, that such unlicensed person has not theretofore had a license revoked, suspended or finally refused.'
