AN ACT Relating to Breaking and Entering Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 131, § 11, amended. Section 11 of chapter 131 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows :

‘Sec. 11. Breaking and entering with intent to commit a felony or any larceny. Whoever, with intent to commit a felony or any larceny, breaks and enters in the daytime or enters without breaking in the nighttime any dwelling house, or breaks and enters any office, bank, shop, store, warehouse, vessel, railroad car of any kind, **motor vehicle**, or building in which valuable things are kept, any person being lawfully therein and put in fear, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one year nor more than 10 years ; but if no person was lawfully therein and put in fear, by imprisonment for not more than 5 years or by a fine of not more than \$500.’
