STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Draggers in Part of Penobscot Bay.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 27-B, additional. Chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 27-B, to read as follows:

'Sec. 27-B. Use of draggers in part of Penobscot Bay. It shall be unlawful, between the first day of November and the first day of the following March, to use a dragger or any other dragging apparatus, except standard scallop drags, for the taking of fish or shellfish on the ocean bottom in that part of Penobscot Bay inside a line drawn from Two Bush Island Light to Metinic Island Ledge Buoy, thence continuing to Duck Rocks Bell Buoy near Monhegan Island, thence northerly to Old Man Ledge Buoy.'
