## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 99th LEGISLATURE

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 418, L. D. 602, Bill, "An Act to Authorize the Issuance of Bonds in the Amount of Fifteen Million Dollars on Behalf of the State of Maine for the Purpose of Building State Highways."

Amend said Bill in the title by striking out the word "Fifteen" and inserting in place thereof the word 'Thirteen'

Further amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out the underlined figures "\$15,000,000" in the headnote and inserting in place thereof the underlined figures '\$13,000,000'

Further amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out the figures "\$15,000,000" in the 6th line and inserting in place thereof the figures '\$13,000,000'

Further amend said Bill by inserting after section 2 a new section to read as follows:

'Sec. 3. Declaration of intent. It is the intent of the 99th Legislature that if the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$13,000,000 is authorized by the Legislature and ratified by the people of the State of Maine in the referendum as provided for in this act, the allocation for Special State Aid Construction for the biennium July 1, 1961 - June 30, 1963 shall be in the amount of \$1,000,000 annually.'

Further amend said Bill in section 3 by striking out the word "Fifteen" in the 11th line and inserting the word 'Thirteen'

Further amend said Bill in section 3 by striking out the underlined abbreviation and figure "Sec. 3." at the beginning of the first line and inserting in place thereof the underlined abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 4.'
