STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Reactivate the Maine Committee on Aging and Authorize a Report to the 1961 White House Conference on Aging.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Committee appointed. The Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall appoint a committee of 15 members. The Governor shall designate the chairman.

Sec. 2. Duties. The committee shall study the problem of Maine's aging population directing itself toward the holding of a state conference for the purpose of developing facts and recommendations and preparing a report of the findings for presentation to the White House Conference on Aging. The committee is authorized to employ sufficient staff, subject to the Personnel Law, to carry out its objectives.

Sec. 3. Federal grants. The Treasurer of State shall be the appropriate fiscal officer of the State to receive federal grants on account of administration of said committee and the State Controller shall authorize expenditures therefrom as approved by the committee.

Sec. 4. Meetings, expenses. The committee shall meet at the call of the chairman. The members shall be paid necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

Sec. 5. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund of the State the sum of \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1960 to the said committee. Such appropriation shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuous carrying account until June 30, 1961.
