STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire, Rental and Expenses of Waterville Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1897, c. 325, § 3, amended. Section 3 of chapter 325 of the private and special laws of 1897, as last amended by section 58 of chapter 160 of the private and special laws of 1957, is further amended to read as follows:
- Sec 3. Judge, salary; clerical assistance. Said court shall consist of one judge, to be appointed in the manner and for the term provided by the Constitution, who shall be a member of the bar in Kennebec County, who shall reside during his continuance in office in said City of Waterville, and who shall receive from the County of Kennebec, in monthly payments, an annual salary of \$3,200, which shall be in full for all fees pertaining to his office; and he shall have the authority to employ such clerical assistance as is necessary, and the eity County of Kennebec shall pay therefor.'
- Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1897, c. 325, § 9, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 9 of chapter 325 of the private and special laws of 1897 is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- 'The City of Waterville shall provide a suitable room for said court and shall furnish the same in an appropriate manner, for which it shall be paid from the treasury of the County of Kennebec, as rental, in quarterly payments, the sum of \$2,000 annually. The County of Kennebec shall purchase blanks, blank-books, seals, dockets and all things necessary for the use of said court.'
