### AN ACT Relating to Closed Time on Deer in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 91, amended. The first 2 paragraphs of section 91 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, are amended to read as follows:

'There shall be an annual open season on deer during the month of November in each calendar year in the Counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, Hancock, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, <del>Oxford</del> Sagadahoc, Waldo, Washington and York. All the rest of the calendar year before and after the open season shall be a closed season on deer.

There shall be an open season on deer in each calendar year beginning the 21st day of October and ending the 30th day of November, both dates inclusive in the Counties of Aroostook, Oxford, Penobscot, Somerset, Piscataquis and Franklin. All of the rest of the calendar year, either before or after the open season, shall be a closed season on deer in these counties.'
