AN ACT Prohibiting Obstruction of Discontinued Woods Roads.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 36, § 90-A, additional. Chapter 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section to be numbered 90-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 90-A. Obstruction of discontinued woods roads prohibited. The obstruction by bulldozing or other means of any trail, truck-trail, woods road or roadway constructed or used by any person to remove forest growth is prohibited upon the discontinuance from use or abandonment of the same if it may be reasonably utilized for preventing and suppressing forest fires, unless permission is first obtained from the Forest Commissioner.

Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100, nor more than \$500.'
