COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 307, L. D. 853, Bill, "An Act
Amending Laws Relating to Employment Offices."

Amend said Bill by adding after the Title and before the enact-
ing clause, the following emergency preamble:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, economic insecurity due to
unemployment is a serious menace to the health, welfare and morals
of the people of the State of Maine; and

Whereas, employment offices perform a vital and necessary
function in obtaining employment for the people of Maine; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary that the following legislation
be effective immediately to lighten the burden which falls so heavily
on the unemployed worker and his family by providing the necessary
machinery to aid the worker in obtaining employment; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create
an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and
require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the
preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill, in that part designated "Sec. 148-A",
by striking out all of the 4th line and inserting in place thereof
the following:

'monthly, $\frac{1}{3}$ $\frac{1}{4}$ of the fee shall be paid for the first 3 4 paydays;'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end the following emer-
gency clause:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the pre-
amble, this act shall take effect when approved.'
