IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Special Dog Training Areas.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 116, amended. The first paragraph of section 116 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

'Upon application of any club or organization having 25 or more members who are citizens who have been residents of the State for at least 6 months immediately prior to making application, and the payment of a fee of \$10, the department may issue a license authorizing the establishment and maintenance by such club or organization on land owned by them, or over which they have legal control, of a special dog training area wherein and whereon dogs may be trained at any time during the year. No such dog training area shall be of less than 100 acres, nor of more than 400 acres, nor shall licenses be issued for more than 24 special dog training areas in any one county.'
