SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 321, L. D. 897, Bill, "An Act to Continue  
the Citizens Committee on Survey of State Government."

Amend said Bill by striking out everything after the Title, and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Committee. The Citizens Committee on the Survey of State Government authorized under Chapter 169 of the Resolves of 1955 and continued by Chapter 186 of the Private and Special Laws of 1957 is hereby reactivated. It shall consist of not more than 40 members: The Speaker of the House shall appoint 10 members; the President of the Senate shall appoint 10 members; the Governor shall appoint other members representative of the general public and shall designate a chairman. Any vacancies shall be filled in like manner.

Sec. 2. Duties. The committee shall continue to study the survey of State Government in the interests of improving the services of State Government to the citizens of this State and to develop a more effective organization of its administration. It is authorized to employ necessary technical and clerical assistance.

Sec. 3. State departments to cooperate. All officers and employees of the State are directed to cooperate fully with the committee and its staff and to afford prompt access to necessary reports and records.

Sec. 4. Expenses. The members of the committee shall be paid necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

Sec. 5. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$18,000 to carry out the purposes of this act. This appropriation shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1961.'
