STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Providing Mandatory Jail Sentence for Second Offense of Driving Under the Influence.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 150, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 150 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 'Any person convicted of a 2nd or subsequent offense shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than 3 nor more than 11 months, which jail sentence shall not be suspended, and in addition thereto, the court may impose a fine as above provided.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 150, amended. The 2nd sentence from the end of the first paragraph of section 150 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 'Any person convicted of a 2nd or subsequent offense of the same gravity shall be punished by imprisonment for not tess than 3 months nor more than 3 years, which jail sentence shall not be suspended, and in addition the court may impose a fine as above provided.'
