STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys for Road from Allagash Plantation to the Canadian Border.

Road from Allagash Plantation to Canadian border; appropriation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$145,000 from the General Highway Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1960 to construct a road for winter and limited summer use extending about 40 miles from Allagash Plantation (Little Black Brook) Aroostook County to the Canadian border along the St. John River.

The expenditure of moneys provided by this resolve shall be under the supervision of the State Highway Commission.

The balance of appropriation remaining unexpended on June 30, 1960 shall be available for the same purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1961.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The road proposed will open up the northern part of Maine from Allagash to the Canadian border. At the present time the route has no road for 5 miles, unimproved road for 8.5 miles, partly improved road for 6 miles and a good gravel road for 20.5 miles.
