RESOLVE, in Favor of Malcolm M. Salisbury of Bar Harbor.

Malcolm M. Salisbury; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$126.25 to be paid to Malcolm M. Salisbury, of Bar Harbor, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the State for hens killed by coons and foxes; said sum to be paid from the Dog Tax Fund.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Salisbury filed a claim in June of 1958 for the loss of 57 chickens to raccoons and foxes and because just one carcass could be found, was compensated for just the one bird according to provisions of the present statute. The chief of police in Bar Harbor investigated Mr. Salisbury's claim and reported to the Department of Agriculture that he found definite evidence of blood and feathers scattered through the underbrush, substantiating the claim.
