AN ACT Relating to Definition of Tavern Under Liquor Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61, § 1, amended. The 4th paragraph from the end of section 1 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, which relates to the definition of Tavern, as amended by chapter 217 of the public laws of 1955, is further amended to read as follows:

“Tavern” shall mean a reputable place for men only operated by responsible persons where no food is sold other than prepared packaged bar snacks and no business is carried on except the sale of cigarettes and tobacco products and except the sale of malt liquor at a bar. There shall be no table, chairs or other seating accommodations, **except stools at the bar**, and all persons served shall **either remain standing or seated** at the bar.’
