AN ACT Creating the Merrymeeting Bay Game Sanctuary.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 149, amended. Section 149 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by inserting in alphabetical order the following paragraph:

‘Merrymeeting Bay Game Sanctuary. A game sanctuary shall be established in Merrymeeting Bay bounded as follows: On the north by a line drawn from a marker at the head of Butler’s Point and running in a westerly direction to the north end of Big Brick Island, thence southerly along eastern shores of Big and Little Brick Island to the south end of Little Brick Island, thence southeasterly to a marker on the shore of Black Water Cove and thence northerly along the shore back to the original starting point.

Within this sanctuary it shall be unlawful at any time to shoot, shoot at, molest or pursue game or game birds of any description, providing, however, that boats may pass through without incurring any penalty.’
