STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Veterans Under Maine State Retirement Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 63-A, § 3, sub-§ VI, amended. The next to the last sentence of subsection VI of section 3 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

'No member who is otherwise entitled to military leave credits shall be deprived of this right if his return to covered employment is delayed beyond the 90 days after his honorable discharge if the delay is eaused by a military service incurred illness or disability; nothing in the preceding provisions of this subsection shall be interpreted or construed to mean other than that veterans receiving honorable separation from the service who entered into the armed forces of the United States in time of war from a position classified under the definition "Teacher" or from a position covered by the Maine State Retirement System shall be allowed full credit toward state retirement benefits, for the said years of service, irrespective of the time of return to covered employment.'
