STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Peddling Malt Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61, § 38, amended. Section 38 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 38. Unlawful to peddle. It shall be unlawful for any wholesale or retail licensee of malt liquor, either directly or indirectly, by any agent or employee, to go from town to town or from place to place in the same town selling or bartering or carrying for sale or exposing for sale, except to a licensee, any malt liquor from any vehicle. All sales of such malt liquor where transportation and delivery are required shall be made only upon orders actually received at the principal place of business or warehouse or distributing center, if licensed, of the soller prior to shipment thereof. An invoice stating the names of the purchaser and the seller and the kind and quantity of malt liquor ordered by the sale sold, together with the date of the sale, shall be carried by the driver or any other employee of the seller who accompanies the driver.

Whoever violates the provisions hereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
