#### STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Survivor Benefits for All State Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 63-A, § 5, amended. The last paragraph of section 5 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 3 of chapter 367 of the public laws of 1957 and as amended by section 1 of chapter 422 of the public laws of 1957, is further amended to read as follows:

'Each member shall, as soon after July 1, 1957 as the board of trustees determines is practicable, make a contribution of ½ of 1% of earnable compensation to the Survivors' Benefit Fund as long as he is employed. Any employee of the State may contribute to the Survivors' Benefit Fund though not a member of the Retirement System, provided he works and draws compensation for at lease 24 hours or 3 normal working days per week during the employment year.'
