HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 419, L. D. 1203, Bill, "An Act Relating to Duties of the Clerk of the House of Representatives."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line 'Sec. 1', and by striking out in said first line the phrase "3rd sentence" and inserting in place thereof, the phrase '3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th sentences.'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof, before the single quotation marks, the following:

'He shall also perform the services required of him by sections 6 and 8. He shall receive be paid a basic salary of \$5,000 for the year in which the Legislature is in regular session and a basic salary of \$1,000 for the year in which the Legislature is not in regular session. For each year of each term in which he shall succeed himself, he shall be paid a 10% increase in the basic salary provided for that year. The 10% increase in each basic salary shall be cumulative for successive terms, but shall not exceed a maximum cumulative increase of 50% in either salary.'

The assistant clerk of the House shall perform his work under the direction of the Clerk and shall be paid a basic salary of \$3,000 for the regular session of the Legislature. For each regular session of the Legislature at which he shall succeed himself, he shall be paid a 10% increase in the basic salary. This increase shall be cumulative for successive terms, but shall not exceed a maximum cumulative increase of 50% of the basic salary.'

'Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall be retroactive to January 1, 1959.'
