AN ACT Relating to Relocation Payments in Eminent Domain.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 90-A, § 66, additional. Chapter 90-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 405 of the public laws of 1957, is amended by adding a new section to be numbered 66, to read as follows :

'Relocation Payments in Eminent Domain.

Sec. 66. Relocation payments in eminent domain. In addition to any damages to which a property owner or tenant may be entitled for all property taken by the exercise of the right of eminent domain by a local public agency or municipality, he shall be entitled to receive "relocation payments." The term "relocation payments" means payments by a local public agency or municipality to individuals, families and business concerns for their reasonable and necessary moving expenses and any actual direct losses of property except goodwill or profit, which are incurred on or after the effective date of this act, and for which reimbursement or compensation is not otherwise made, resulting from their displacement by condemnation. Such payments shall not exceed \$100 in the case of an individual or family, or \$2,500 in the case of a business concern.'
