AN ACT Relating to Use of Draggers in Part of Penobscot Bay.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 38, § 27-B, additional. Chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 27-B, to read as follows :

'Sec. 27-B. Use of draggers in part of Penobscot Bay. It shall be unlawful, from the first day of October to the first day of the following February, to use a dragger or any other dragging apparatus, except standard scallop drags, for the taking of fish or lobsters on the ocean bottom in that part of Penobscot Bay inside a line drawn from Southern Island to south end of Clark Island, to White Head Island, to Two Bush Island, to Metinic Island Ledge Buoy, to Duck Rock Buoy west of Monhegan Island, to Old Man Ledge Buoy, to Burnt Island, to West side of Mosquito Island, thence back to point of beginning.'
